



HAVE YOUR SAY! PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CITY OF CAPE TOWN MUNICIPAL PLANNING BY-LAW, 2015 (MPBL)

The City of Cape Town Municipal Planning By-Law, 2015 (MPBL) came into force on 1 July 2015. The City, in its attempts to continuously improve the MPBL, is now considering amending the MPBL.

In terms of section 17 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, Act 32 of 2000, the public and interested parties or groups are given the opportunity to submit comments, recommendations or input to the municipality from 1 March 2019 to 1 April 2019.
